




Goals of The Completion Arch

- Collect, organize and explain the vast amount of publicly-available data currently used to measure community college student progress and success.
- Consolidate efforts of initiatives by compiling set of common metrics and summarizing national, state and initiative-level indicators.
- Illustrate scope and complexity of the community college mission.
- Highlight the progress and success of community college students.
- Educate about scope of metrics used to measure community college success.
- Illustrate how metrics were derived, proper use of the metrics, and need for new metrics in areas where none currently exist.
- Facilitate a national discussion about metrics that best illustrate progress.
- Promote awareness and communication across national college completion initiatives.



Framework





Elements and Features

- Database includes publicly-available data from national, state, regional sources.
- Website focus on all aspects of the community college student trajectory, from enrollment through workforce preparation and placement.
- Website will be free to any user.
- Features include building indicator lists by state, data source, or a variety of characteristics associated with select indicators to download raw data files.
- Website is dynamic and will be updated twice per year. New metrics added when available.
- An annual print report will also be issued.
- Website is non-evaluative (no institution- or student-level data will be included).
- Background information about all the measures included: How metrics were derived; who is counted (and who is not); and why the metric is important.
