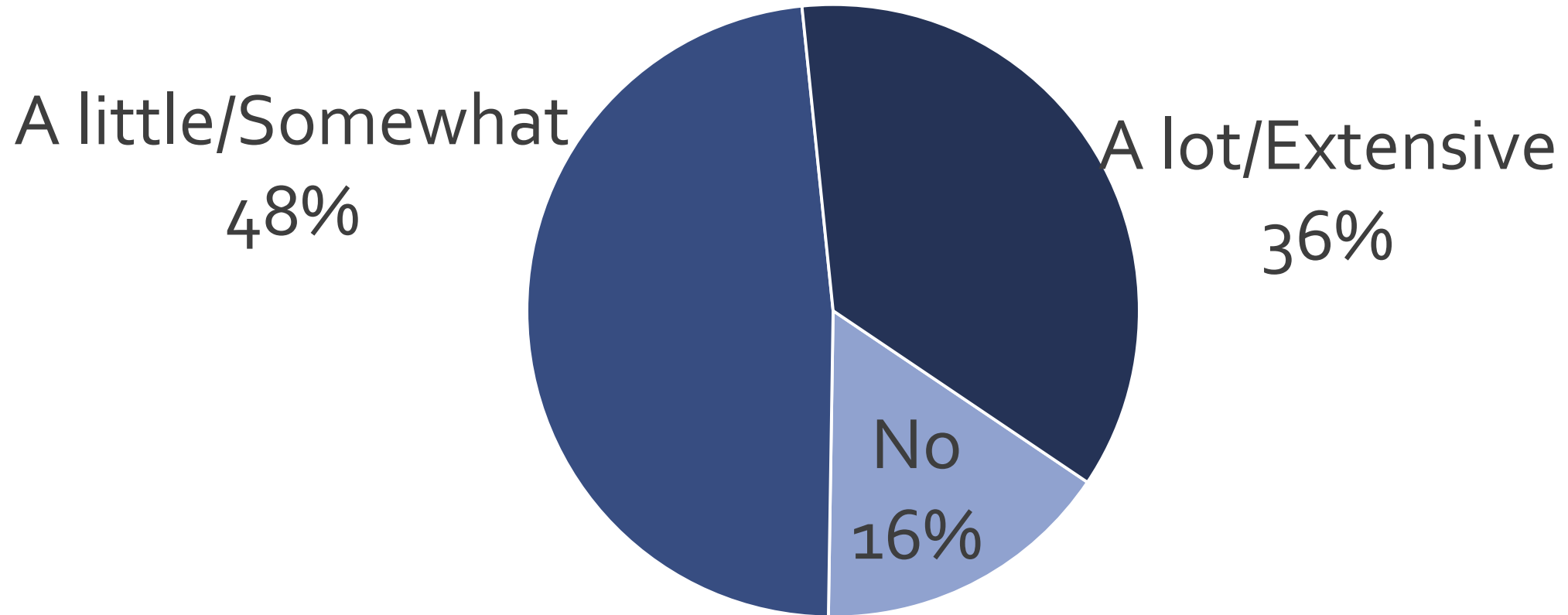
This study covers...

- and 12 states (NE, MW, S, and W)

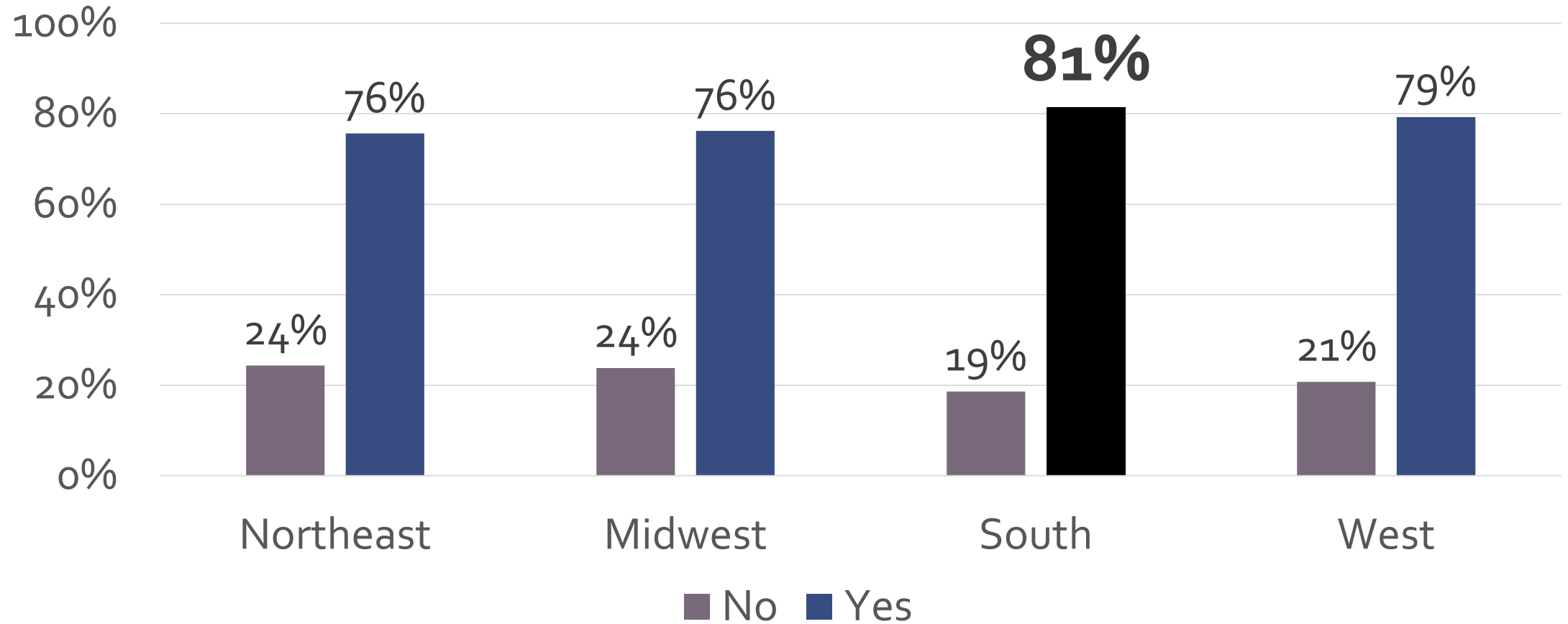
# Who are Immigrant Students?

- About 88% of immigrant students are US born.

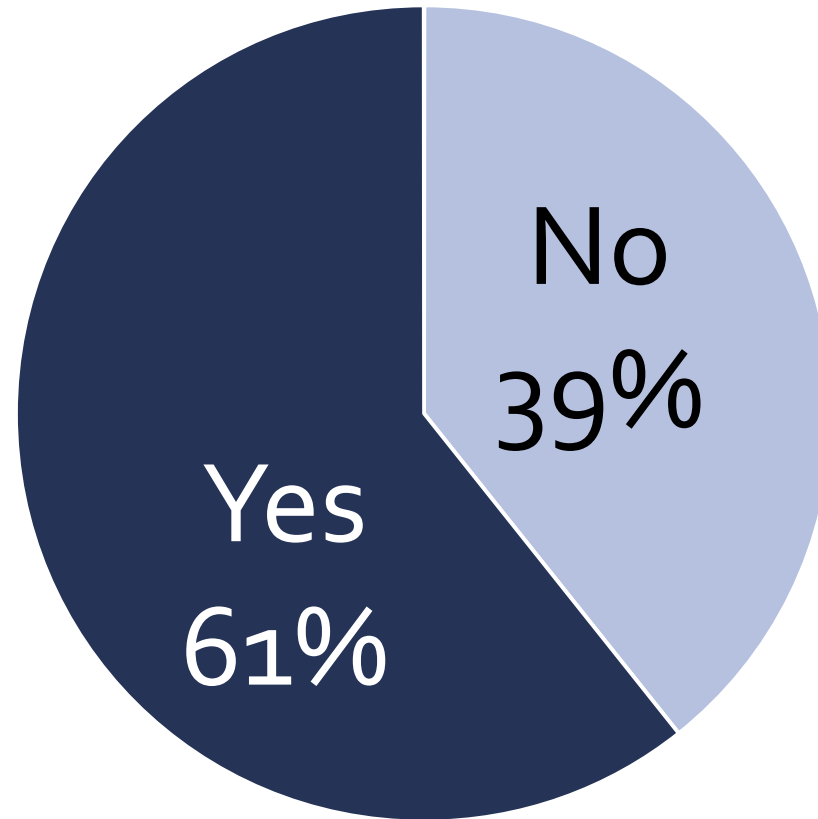

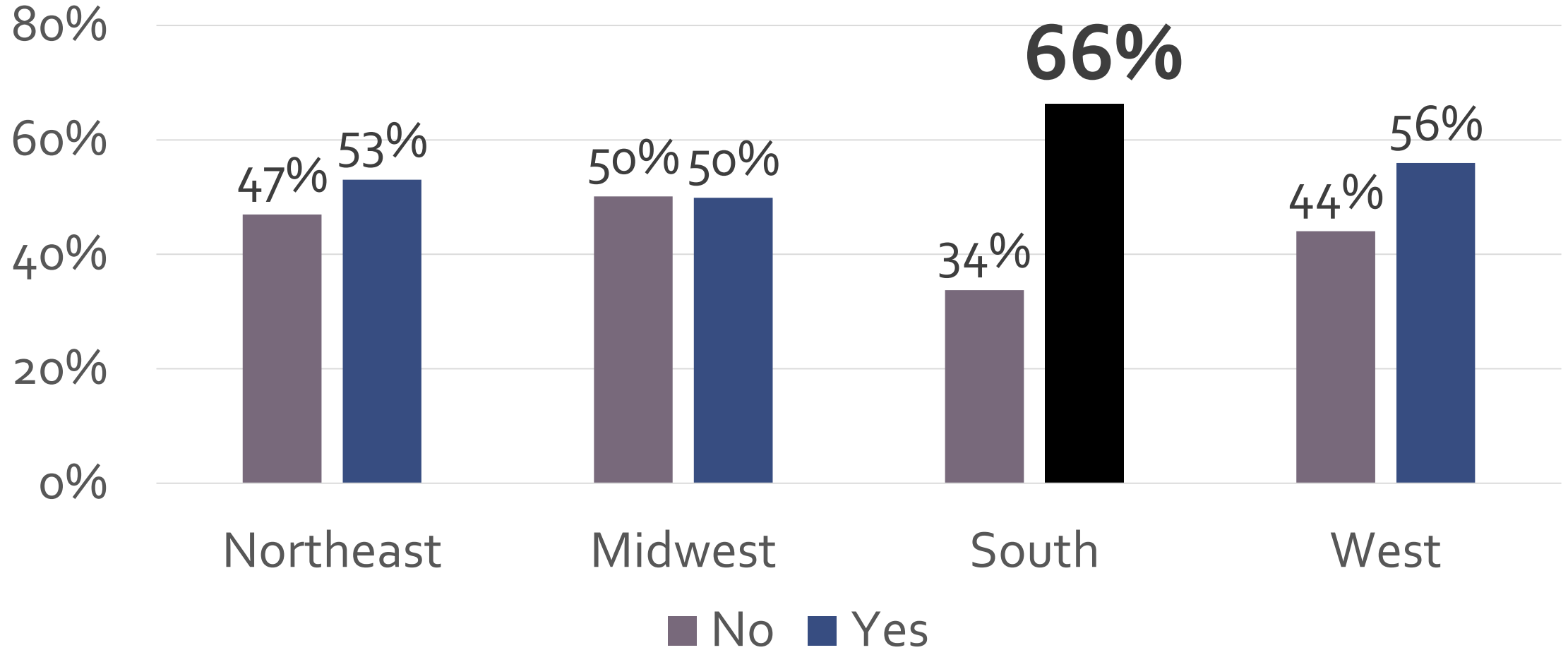
# Behavioral or Emotional Problems



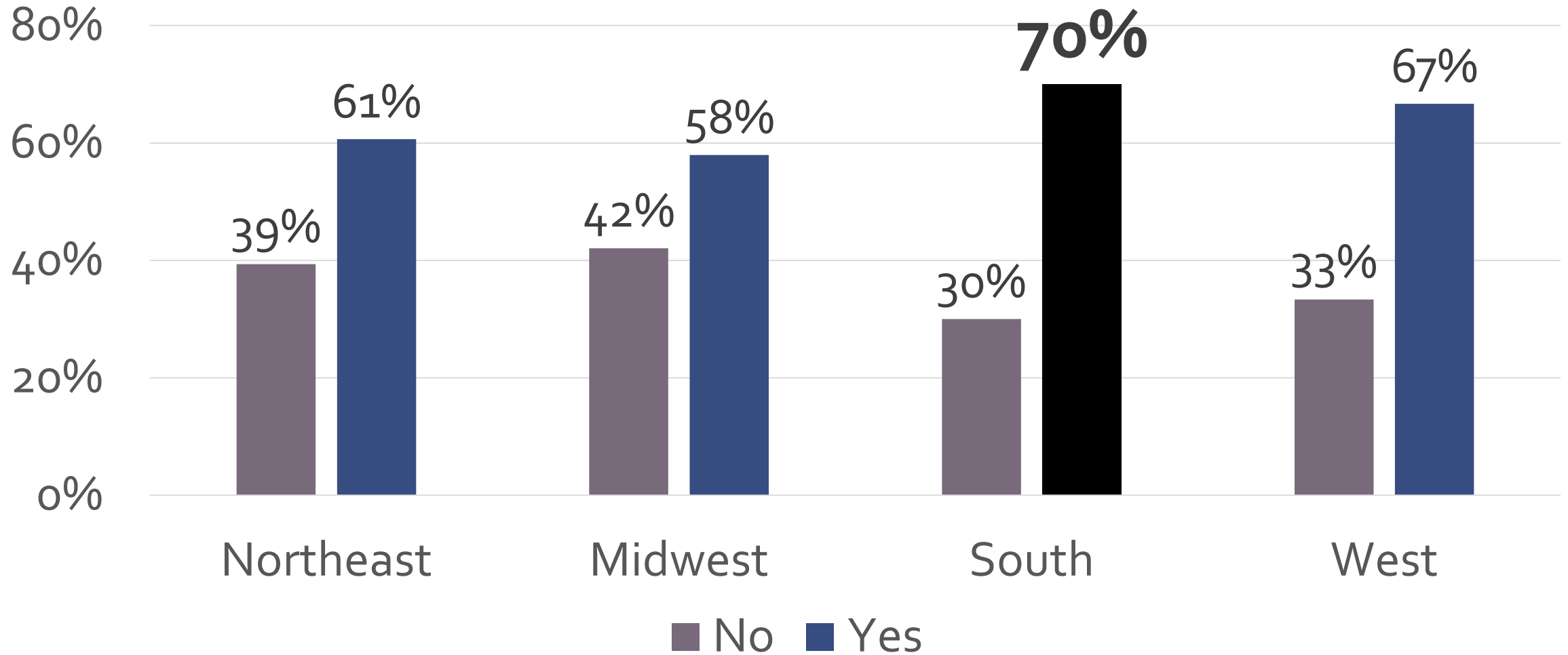
# Impact on Academic Performance
